It is with a great deal of sadness that York City Branch reports the passing of our friend and colleague John Michael Lane, (Johnny), after a very short but quite intense illness that he fought with a great deal of dignity and a quite amazing degree of humour.

Branch Secretary Frank Healy reports that even in the latter stages of John's illness at St Leonard's Hospice in York he was still making the wonderful staff, as well as his visiting friends and family, laugh.

John was the Club Secretary and Concert Chairman of Acomb WMC, York and he was also a very valued member of the York City Branch Executive.

Early on in his tenure as Club Secretary at Acomb WMC, John was instrumental in saving the club when an investigation by HMRC could have closed it down.

Through very testing times he and his colleagues kept the club afloat and John sometimes made interest-free personal loans to the club as they were needed to enable the club to pay invoices until sufficient funds could be banked.

One of the proudest moments in his club life came in 2011, (due in a very large part to John's past experience as a Manager with Northern Electric), when he collected the 'Green Club of the Year' Award on behalf of his beloved Acomb WMC at the Club Mirror Awards in Manchester.

He also received the 10-Year Merit Award



for his service to Acomb WMC.

Following in the footsteps of Acomb WMC legends, Alan Dawson and Roy Brown, as Concert Chairman, he certainly added to the enjoyment when presenting acts whilst wearing masks of such celebrities as Simon Cowell which generally attracted howls of laughter from club members.

A great supporter of the Guide Dogs for the Blind charity, Johnny once produced an honorary membership card with club number 'DOG1' for a member's guide dog named Cracker.

His colleagues would like to express their thanks for his service to the Branch and send their condolences to his wife Carol, to John's daughters Julie, Vicky and Gemma and to all of his family.



RYTON SOCIAL CLUB, TYNE & WEAR

Ryton Social Club in Tyne & Wear recently held the Grand Opening of its new-look Concert Room following an ambitious £60,000 refurbishment and is now looking to the future with huge confidence

Ryton Social Club is situated approximately seven miles west of Newcastle, having moved from its previous village location in 1968 to its present home on the main road that runs through the centre of Ryton.

The club is in a busy locale, surrounded by businesses, large and small, that have grown around the club in recent years.

These include a large -Co-op supermarket, an opticians, a post office and a betting shop.

Taking full advantage of its great position, the club has members and visitors popping in and out throughout the day, ensuring the tills are always ringing

The club has approximately 1,000 members currently on its books and is open from 12pm every day until 11pm in the evening with an extension to 11.30pm on Fridays and Saturdays.

There is free Wi-Fi throughout the club while the Concert Room can facilitate large gatherings and host big events such as sporting finals and presentations.

The room holds up to 300 people and has just undergone a £60,000 refurbishment which has completely updated the space.

“It has been a real transformation,” says Club Treasurer Maurice Baines. “We ripped out the old bar and replaced it with a new modern design. The stage has also been completely replaced with new curtains and a new stage floor, all of which has brought the club into the 21st century.

“The refurbishment of the Concert Room has been a real transformation and has brought the club into the 21st century”

“The main area of the room has been re-carpeted and decorated to a high standard with features such as eye-catching safety barriers along the entire width of the room, dividing the three levels of the room from bar to stage.

“We also replaced all the tables and chairs and the back seating was all re-covered with new cloth to blend in with the new colour scheme.”

In February, the club held a special Grand Opening night for the new-look Concert Room, an evening which saw Club Secretary Ken Gascoigne – also a member of the Durham Branch Executive – presented with his 40-year Long Service Award.

The Bar and Downstairs Lounge have also been re-decorated to the same standard to ensure the members are even more proud of their club than they were previously.

Sport is one of the key attractions offered by the Bar with a dartboard and two pool tables situated there, as well as a big screen TV and two smaller televisions showing all the key live sport.

“We have Sky Sports and it’s always busy for the Newcastle United games so we’re delighted that they’re going to be back in the Premier League next season which should be a major boost for the club,” says Maurice, himself a Season Ticket holder at St James’s Park.

“We also have live racing on throughout the week. There’s a betting shop just across the road so members can go out and put a bet on and then come into the club, have a drink and watch the race.”

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“The Downstairs Lounge is a place to relax and have a drink with friends,” explains Maurice.

“The Committee decided, following requests from members, to install a jukebox into the Lounge and this has proved really popular with both the younger and older members.

“Whenever you go into the Lounge you can hear music from the 1940s right up to the modern era. The club is now benefiting from this income as well as the extra bar sales this feature brings.”

The club also has a beautiful upstairs room – The Willow Lounge – which overlooks the picturesque Ferndene Park as well as offering views across the Tyne Valley and the award-winning ‘Britain in Bloom’ town of Ryton. The Willow Lounge is also very popular with members who wish to host smaller events such as christenings.

There is a wealth of activities going on at the club throughout the week. It starts on a Monday with men’s darts followed by the ladies darts on a Tuesday. Tuesdays, Fridays and Sunday mornings there is bingo in the Concert Room.

On a Sunday evening, there is live entertainment as well as bingo, Play Your Cards Right and a fun quiz, all hosted by the regular compere Scott ‘Scotty’ Adair.

As you might expect, the club offers a good variety of beers, lagers, ciders and spirits with the top sellers being Caffrey’s

and Carling, while the recent introduction of Strongbow Fruit Cider has been an immediate success with members. Other big sellers at the club include John Smith’s Stones, Foster’s and Coors Lite, all on draught.

The club prides itself on being very family-orientated and allows members to bring their children into the Downstairs Lounge during the day where a wide range of soft drinks is available.

But the family ethos doesn’t stop there. “For the last 20 years we’ve held an annual Christmas party for children which has

been going on for over 20 years,” says Maurice.

“It’s great to see kids who have attended those parties over the years growing up and then becoming members of the club themselves.”

The club is an active member of the CIU, often hosting major regional darts and pool finals.

With its first-class facilities, welcoming atmosphere and array of community activities and events, it is clear that Ryton Social Club is looking to the future with huge confidence.

SPOTLIGHT ON... DAVE RICHARDSON

We talk to Northumberland Branch Secretary Dave Richardson to get his views on the current club scene and why he believes providing free Wi-Fi is a good idea for clubs

How did you first become involved with clubs and the CIU?

I first got involved with CIU clubs when I was 18. My father got my membership for my 18th birthday, as was the norm in my area. I joined the Committee when I was 25 years old and I did 25 years as a Committee person and later Secretary. I became involved with The Northumberland CIU in November 2003 as an Executive Member and became Branch Secretary in March 2009.

How are clubs faring in the Northumberland Branch?

It's been difficult for clubs over the past few years with the recession and price increases but most clubs are getting by and that's down to good management.

What three things would you ask the Prime Minister for on behalf of clubs?

Firstly, to reduce the rate of VAT to clubs. Secondly to stop supermarkets selling cheap alcohol. Thirdly, to reduce duty on beer which would help our clubs financially.

Are there any particular areas of modern life which you see as having a knock-on effect to clubs?

The huge rise in the use of social media. It's good to see most Union clubs are offering free Wi-Fi which seems to attract the younger element.

What aspirations do you have for clubs over the next 12 months?

For them all to achieve their profit margins and to keep them all in the Union.

What do you say to the doom-mongers out there?

Be positive instead of negative. Our clubs are part of the community and do a great deal to improve their local areas. One aspect of this is the huge amount of money raised for local and

national charities from events held in our clubs.

What are the most positive signs you've seen in the club sector in the past three years?

I have seen more younger people frequenting clubs in recent years which is a positive sign as we need to keep the young interested.

If you could award an OCE (Order of the Club Empire) who would it be to and why?

To all Club Secretaries for the hard work they do behind the scenes to keep clubs running.

What clubs do you belong to and which is your favourite club?

I have been a member of three clubs in my area for over 30 years - Bedlington Social Club, Netherton Social Club and Bedlington Station Social Club.

Which is your favourite club?

Obviously I have three – the ones I belong to!

Who has been your biggest influence in your club life?

My wife of 39 years, Sheila. She has supported me in everything I have done in club life.

CIU CLUBS URGED TO IGNORE ‘MISLEADING’ LETTER

Clubs are being warned about a misleading letter which has been received through the post by several Union clubs and which purports to be from an organisation called the ‘England Commercial Register - Publication of Companies’.

The letter states: “in order to avoid the removal of your incomplete company details, please revise and approve your information promptly” and includes a form (see below) which it says is the company information “as listed on our database” with a request that

the blank spaces be filled in by the respondent.

However, in the small print at the foot of the form, there is a clause which, if signed, appears to bind your club/company to place the information as “an advertising insert for a period of three years” at an annual cost of 993 Euros (£856) per year.

The letter and form has been examined by the NEC and its recommendation is to ignore this communication entirely and throw it in the bin.

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A REMINDER TO CLUBS ABOUT SUBSCRIPTION CARD RULES

Clubs are being reminded that Subscription Cards must have the name and address of the issuing club clearly marked on them in order to ensure doormen can implement the rules of the union when Associate Members are visiting clubs other than their own.

The Associate Card supplied by the Union clearly states: “An Associate before being admitted to the Club must produce their Subscription Card (showing that their current subscription to their club has been paid).

Several instances across various branches have been reported of

Associate Members visiting other clubs but being unable to produce a subscription card stating exactly what club they belonged to.

It appears that some clubs are simply issuing a Subscription Card which shows that a payment has been made by the holder but not which club they are actually a member of.

Ensuring that all members have the correct credentials will help avoid ill-feeling and embarrassment when Associate Members visit other CIU clubs, as they are perfectly entitled to under the Union rules.

Union President George Dawson CMD looks at the benefits to clubs of being part of the CIU, which for over 150 years has been ensuring that its members have all the tools they need to survive and flourish

It's clear that, 155 years after it was founded, the CIU continues to be an organisation which fulfils a vital function for its member clubs and in turn for the local communities which they serve.

As the largest non-profit making social entertainment and leisure organisation in the UK, the CIU is able to give our clubs a voice at national level and ensure that the concerns of our many millions of members are being communicated effectively and regularly to those at the highest levels of government.

We also provide a full range of services to our member clubs, not least in the vitally important area of education. Since 1934, the Union's Club Management Diploma (CMD) has equipped club men and women with the knowledge of best practice in such areas as Club Law, Book-Keeping and Financial Control.

Our education programme continues to evolve and later this year we'll be rolling out our new Club Management qualification.

This new course has already been piloted in various areas of the country and will help to make our education programme even more accessible to our members as they strive to run their clubs with maximum efficiency.

We also provide a framework which recognises the hard work and dedication that goes on week-in, week-out in clubs and our official magazine, *Club Journal*, is filled with those who are celebrating milestones in service to their clubs or branches and have earned

Certificates of Merit and Long Service Awards. We have also recently reintroduced Long Service Gold Medals and Bars to mark these milestones.

The same department also deals with clubs' affiliation to the Union. Incidentally, we have also recently produced a generic Rules Book for unaffiliated clubs and hope

that this will help any such clubs who do not currently belong to our Union or other club associations.

Being part of the CIU also enables clubs to get involved with our thriving sports and games competitions at both a national and branch level and many professional darts, snooker and pool players have honed their skills in the games rooms of our clubs.

There are also many events throughout the year which members of CIU clubs can attend, including the Beer & Trades Exhibition which takes place during our Annual Conference weekend in Blackpool each April.

Each November we stage the annual CIU Charity Raceday at Wetherby Racecourse in Yorkshire, with around 1,700 members from right across the country enjoying a great day out.

WHAT CAN THE CIU DO FOR YOUR CLUB?

Here's an in-depth look at the many services and benefits offered by the CIU to its affiliated clubs, including legal advice, the chance to learn about club law and finance through the Union's Education Programme and the opportunity to take part in sports competitions at both National and Branch level

Advice and Help for Clubs

Affiliated clubs can take advantage of the resources of the CIU through their local Branch Secretary and from Head Office with assistance offered in legal proceedings where matters of club principles are involved. The Union has also produced a series of contracts and handbooks which take in the current legislative requirements, including the Club Secretary Handbook which is regularly updated to include the most recent changes to employment law. The Union also runs an Arbitration Training programme to assist club officials.

Club Journal

Club Journal is the Union's official monthly magazine and is a must-read for CIU members. Each month the magazine features news from around the branches, club profiles, opinion columns from leading Union figures, business-building advice from the experts, sporting news and results, plus details of the CIU Racing Club discounts available to members and regular competitions. Each affiliated club receives one free copy of the monthly magazine while an annual subscription costs £7.50 and gives you 12 copies for the price of 10.

Education

The Union's Club Management Diploma (CMD) and residential Club Law and Club Finance weekends give officials the chance to learn everything they need to know to run their clubs with maximum efficiency. The CMD was established in 1934 and covers club law, administration, book-keeping and accountancy. In addition, the Union is set to launch a new qualification which underlines the Union's aim to make education regarding the business of running clubs even more accessible to its members.

PRS Tariff

The CIU has negotiated a special discount for its clubs with the Performing Right Society (PRS) which collects and distributes licence fees for the use of music on behalf of songwriters, composers and performers. The PRS licence covers music played through radios, CDs, streaming on the internet, music on TVs and also live music performances. The tariff for Members' Clubs is printed annually and placed as an insert in *Club Journal* while it can also be downloaded from the CIU website: www.wmciu.org.uk

Charity

CIU clubs are at the forefront of raising funds for an array of national and local charities with members getting involved in a range of activities – from charity darts marathons and sponsored bike rides to special fundraising concerts and entertainment nights. As well as countless local charities, many national charities benefit from CIU events that are held throughout the year at our clubs, including Macmillan Cancer Support, Diabetes UK, the Alzheimers Society, the British Heart Foundation and the Poppy Appeal.

Lobbying on Behalf of Clubs

Union officials have been at the forefront of helping shape legislation across a number of areas of crucial importance to clubs through the CIU's involvement with the All-Party Parliamentary Group for Non-Profit Making Private Members' Clubs. This group, which meets quarterly at Westminster, gives the Union direct access to both Members of Parliament and Peers from right across the political spectrum. Rules

The CIU Rules Department deal with all matters relating to rules on behalf of clubs, the Union and the Branches. The preparation of all rule changes for the approval of the club members, the registration with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) and the printing through the Union's printer, are all dealt with in the Department at Head Office. The Department also deals with clubs' affiliation to the Union. Events - CIU National Charity Raceday

Dransfields CIU National Charity Raceday is an annual event, held at Wetherby Racecourse in November. This is one of the highlights of the CIU calendar and the 2016 event saw 1,700 Union members heading to Yorkshire to enjoy a fantastic day out as they raised over £3,000 for the CIU's Education Programme. There is always a great atmosphere in the CIU marquee, situated next to the Winners Enclosure, with discounted beer and hearty food on offer. The CIU also runs an annual Greyhound Racing night each September at Sheffield's Owlerton Stadium.

Events - CIU Beer & Trades Exhibition

Taking place during Conference Weekend each April, the CIU Beer & Trades Exhibition provides a great opportunity for club delegates to attend a free trade show which is specifically targeted at the needs of CIU clubs. The show provides a great day out for club folk, as the many exhibitors – including several of the CIU's Preferred Suppliers such as Dransfields, Heineken UK, AON UK and Smart Energy – show attendees how they can help increase profits and save money on running costs at their clubs.

Sport & Games

The Union is one of the biggest organisers of sporting competitions in the country with more than 2,000 trophies, valued at around £500,000, being competed for at both a National and Branch level. The following Indoor Championships are held annually: Team Darts, Team Pool, Team Snooker, Individual Snooker, Individual Darts, Individual Pool, Dominoes 5s and 3s, Dominoes Straights and Cribbage Pairs. There is also a very well respected Dransfields-sponsored CIU National Quiz competition which attracts some of the UK's top quizzers.

WILL THE BRITISH & IRISH LIONS ROAR IN NZ?

With all 10 games of the 2017 British & Irish Lions tour of New Zealand showing exclusively live on Sky Sports this summer, we caught up with the broadcaster's commentary duo, Stuart Barnes and Miles Harrison, to get their opinions on how the tourists will fare in the Test series against the World Champions

It's something of an understatement to say that Stuart Barnes and Miles Harrison have clocked up a fair few air miles during their time as Sky Sports rugby union commentators.

The duo, who have been working together for over 20 years at Sky, have forged their much-amièred professional partnership in commentary boxes at iconic stadiums all over the world.

From Welford Road to Waikato, from Dublin to Dunedin and all points inbetween, the authoritative and expert voices of Barnes and Harrison have accompanied some of the most iconic moments in recent rugby union history seen on our screens, not least the 2013 British & Irish Lions tour when Sam Warburton's men won a historic 2-1 series victory against the Wallabies.

Now the pair are preparing for another epic Lions adventure as they travel the 10,000-odd miles to New

Zealand to cover the class of 2017 as they take on the World Champion All Blacks in their own backyard.

We caught up with the pair at Sky Sports HQ just days before their departure for the 'Land of the Long White Cloud' to find out just what they're expecting during the tour as the Lions aim to win their first series in New Zealand since 1971.

"This is a massive challenge," says Barnes. "The fact that New Zealand haven't lost a home Test since 2009 and haven't lost a Test in Auckland - where they will play the Lions twice on this tour - since 1994 just gives you the scale of the task for the team.

"If the Lions go out there and win the series they'll be the greatest rugby team in the history of the sport, eclipsing the achievement of England winning the World Cup in 2003."

Barnes, who was part of the Lions squad which toured New Zealand in 1993 and lost the series 2-1,

knows more than most about the arduous nature of touring the toughest rugby environment on earth.

"I absolutely loved touring New Zealand as a player," he says. "The team bus would roll into a small town and you'd be greeted by a party of Maori elders and a huge crowd of fans all wanting to catch a glimpse of the players.

"New Zealanders are fanatical supporters of the game and while they want the All Blacks to win, they also want them to see their team test themselves against the best, hence the massive excitement around the Lions. You really feel like you're at the epicentre of world rugby when you're in New Zealand.

"As a player, it's the 'boy scout' adventure of the whole enterprise which appeals to you and the chance to be part of the history of the Lions.

"But it's not just the players who feel that affinity with the team and the fans also have a huge connec-

tion. Whenever I'm walking around Bath or London or wherever, I'll see people wearing the Lions jersey and it's a brand which unites rugby people from England, Ireland, Scotland and Wales. They really feel that connection with the team."

While a huge army of travelling fans will make the long pilgrimage to New Zealand, the vast majority of fans will be back at home, enjoying the action unfold on Sky Sports at a time when they'd normally be polishing off a bowl of cornflakes.

"For many rugby fans, a Lions tour is bigger than a World Cup," says Harrison. "The Lions transcends the sport in many ways and it attracts interest from people who probably aren't rank and file rugby supporters the rest of the time. Mates at my cricket club, who aren't big rugby fans, have been talking about the Lions for weeks.

"The New Zealanders are also really excited about taking on the cream of British and Irish players, particularly as the 2005 series was so one-sided with the Lions failing to deliver on the rugby front.

"The breakfast time kick-offs in the UK offer a really fun aspect to watching the game. We're seeing pubs and clubs really encouraging people to come down and watch the rugby in the bar alongside like-minded peo-

ple by offering breakfast deals and the like.

"When you're on tour it's easy to get caught up in the 'tour bubble' but when I'm commentating, foremost in my mind is the image of the supporters back in the UK, packed into a bar with their mates, yelling on their team and enjoying the experience."

So, do the pair think that the Lions have a chance of turning the tide of history and recording their first series win in New Zealand for 46 years?

"Of course the Lions have a chance," says Barnes. "In a game of rugby with 15 blokes against another 15 blokes, anything can happen. You only need four or five players on one team to be slightly off their game and you'll get a shock result.

"Look at how the Scarlets upset the odds to win the Pro 12 Cup, beating Leinster and Munster in successive weeks or how Exeter Chiefs turned over Saracens in the Aviva Premiership semi-final before going on to win the title.

"The Lions have some exceptionally talented players at their disposal, including some world-class goal-kickers. While All Black fly-half Beauden Barrett is one of the most exciting players in world rugby, his goal-kicking is most definitely not world-class.

"So, if come the Tests, it rains and the conditions are

wet and muddy and it turns into a six-point game, then I'd back the Lions to kick their goals and win."

Harrison also believes that the Lions' chances should not be dismissed out of hand.

"Of course it's going to be tough against a side of New Zealand's pedigree on their home turf but there are definitely some good arguments which suggest that the Lions could be competitive this time around," he says.

"We've just experienced a very high-quality Six Nations Championship which has shown northern hemisphere rugby in a very good light.

"There's also the recent success of England in the Test arena, winning two successive Six Nations title as well as whitewashing Australia 3-0 in the Test series last summer.

"Many of the standout players from that series are now with the Lions, alongside the best players that Ireland, Scotland and Wales have to offer.

"And don't forget Ireland's magnificent 40-29 victory over New Zealand in Chicago back in November which showed that the All Blacks are not invincible."

Whatever the final results, you can be assured that many sports fans will want to see the action unfold in their club.

The new energy app comes from the firm Powershop which was founded in New Zealand in 2009 by energy industry veteran Ari Sargent who has joined in partnership with the utility provider Npower.

The founder likes to view energy the same way as any other product we buy and he has successfully built a digital company which operates in New Zealand, Australia and the UK selling what is known as 'powerpacks' or bundles of electricity.

With this new developed app the company is hoping to become a recognised familiar name in many homes across the UK in order to help consumers make buying energy for our

homes or business a much simpler process.

Instead of cheaper tariffs, the Powershop app is the first fully digital supplier of energy and uses flexibility by offering more control to any consumers who are technology and mobile-savvy.

At present most homes here in the UK will have a smart meter installed by the year 2020 so we can expect to see new suppliers and existing energy providers entering the market who are able to offer more competition in the future.

Consumers using this new technology can go to the website and choose from a variety of shapes and sizes for their own powerpack.

The consumer can then decide when and where they need power. The app will also show each individual consumer in detail how much it has cost to use their electrical supply through various times during the day or night.

This works in a similar way to how smart meters operate while giving new pioneering ways for more simple consumer energy control.




