What the General Data Protection Regulations mean for your club

The General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR) came into force on May 25. The Union's Legal Consultant, Allyn Walton, outlines what this means for our clubs

The General Data Protection Regulation 2016/679 is a regulation in EU law on data protection and privacy for individuals within the EU. It addresses the export of data...

Woah, let's stop for a moment and see if we can boil this down. If we can put practical steps in place, then we can stop worrying about this, right?

BUT isn't there a fine? Don't you have to pay 4% of your annual turnover or £20 million if you get this wrong?... Well no actually; the UK department responsible for its enforcement, the ICO (Information Commissioner's Office) has said it will concentrate on training before it imposes fines. You suspect they're bound to come along one day.

So, what does GDPR mean? The two objectives of GDPR are:

- 1) To give citizens and residents back control of their data.
- 2) To simplify the regulatory environment for business within the EU.

Question: doesn't Brexit mean we should not apply it? The Government has confirmed that Brexit will not affect the GDPR start date, May 25, 2018. Also, that post-Brexit, the UK's own law will mirror the GDPR.

Question: does this even apply to clubs? We don't 'process' or 'control' data, do we? Can I recommend that we try to forget about this 'Am I a processor or controller of data' question. Here's why:

Club Journal – when you send off the names, addresses etc. of members to Head Office and they get sent to the *Club Journal*, the Club is a Controller and the CIU is a Processor.

CCTV – clubs are controllers. Remember when you store images of members going in/out of the entrance or your bar-staff carrying out duties the ICO regards that as

personal data and you're a controller of it!

Payroll – when you collect information such as NI numbers, date of birth, etc. to allow HMRC to process tax and NI contributions and you manage data on a spreadsheet you've built yourself, you're both controller and processor.

In other words, it's a mixed bag. But the reason this isn't helpful for clubs is... even if you are JUST a Controller you still have a legal responsibility to make sure that the contracts with Processors follow GDPR principles.

That's why we're just going to talk about simple steps to take.

When dealing with personal data you should follow these steps:

- Consider processing personal data so you can't tell from looking to which person it relates.
- Use passwords and encourage employees not to share them and change them.
- Encrypt data where possible.
- Only process personal data that's necessary.
- Set up policies and keep records to prove you are compliant.
- Keep recruitment data for no longer than necessary.

You also need to:

INFORM PEOPLE UPFRONT about your lawful basis for processing their personal data. You need to communicate this information to individuals preferably using a **PRIVACY NOTICE**. You should have received a letter from the WMCIU with a sample Notice for your clubs. Pin this on your notice boards, send out with emails or use with letters to your members.

SPECIAL CATEGORY DATA – i.e. data revealing racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, religious beliefs etc. This also covers genetic and biometric data, data about health and data about a person's sex life or sexual

orientation e.g. medical records. This MUST be handled sensitively. I recommend you contact Head Office for further advice only if necessary.

CONSENT is a lawful basis for processing data, but there are alternatives. When someone applies to join an organisation such as the CIU there are lots of rules and regulations in place to protect them. These rules act as Consents – e.g. a right to arbitration if suspended or expelled by your club. Don't worry too much about Consent.

RIGHT TO BE FORGOTTEN. If members or employees either withdraw their consent to their personal data or if keeping that data is no longer required, e.g. they leave the club, they have this right. BUT remember you need to prove you've done it.

SUBJECT ACCESS RIGHTS. Prepare to meet access requests within a one-month timeframe. Under the GDPR, citizens may access their personal data, rectify anything inaccurate and object to processing in certain circumstances, or erase the personal data you may hold. Each request carries a deadline of one month and must be provided free.

The good news is that the GDPR recognises that smaller businesses like clubs need different treatment to large or public bodies.

You need to review your existing processing so you can document everything and inform individuals.

But if you are confident that your existing approach complied with the existing Act, you are unlikely to need to change your current practices too drastically.



'The Big Club' profits from Council energy initiative

Newton Aycliffe Workingmen's Club in Durham Branch, known as The Big Club, is reaping the rewards of energy efficiency after teaming up with a council project.

The Business Energy Efficiency Project (BEEP) is a Durham County Council led project, supported by the European Regional Development Fund (ERDF), to help small businesses in County Durham save money by reducing their energy consumption.

The Big Club contacted BEEP after its new Management Committee decided to identify areas of the company where money was being wasted.

The BEEP team carried out a free in-depth energy audit on the premises and identified the most cost effective solutions which included replacing the inefficient internal and external cellar chiller units, updating the lighting in the building and replacing the outdated drinks pump chiller units in the cellar and bar areas.

The club was awarded a 40 per cent grant from BEEP to support the cost of purchase and installation of replacing the cellar chiller units with modern equipment.

The club also worked with their brewery to replace the pump chiller units, and took the BEEP team's advice to replace the lighting throughout the building with LEDs.

Alan Nelson, Joint Secretary of The Big Club, said: "The BEEP team have been very helpful and always on hand to advise and guide us. We are delighted by the financial saving we are seeing through better energy management and the efficient equipment the BEEP team recommended."

Calum Baker, BEEP Project Manager, said: "We were really pleased to work with Newton Aycliffe Workingmen's Club and help them to make reductions with financial costs and energy consumption.

"Many businesses waste thousands of pounds every year doing simple things like leaving lights or equipment on when not in use or using inefficient equipment and we help them to understand energy better and make improvements.

"Through the improvements the club has made from our recommendations, it has seen a great result and reduced its energy consumption by 85 per cent."

The Business Energy Efficiency Project launched in 2017, in partnership with Business Durham.

The team provides County Durham SMEs with fully funded energy audits and advice and offers grant funds to support the installation of energy efficient equipment.

HEINEKEN UK unveils new strategy to boost business



Burnley Miners Club opened in 1918 and celebrated its Centenary in May



BURNLEY MINERS CLUB, LANCASHIRE

Last month saw Burnley Miners Club marking its centenary with a weekend of special activities which celebrated its rich history, including its links with the Accrington Pals Regiment and Benedictine

Opening in May 1918 as the Burnley Miners Association Prosperity Lodge Working Mens Social Club & Institute, Burnley Miners Club has now notched up a full century at the heart of its local community.

“This is a fantastic achievement for the club to reach this milestone and the members were very excited to celebrate it,” says Club Secretary Alan Kennedy.

“Some of the older members – myself included – can remember the 50th anniversary and it’s great that we’ve made it another half century and are still going strong.”

The club held a full Centenary Weekend of events and activities from Friday, May 19 to Sunday, May 21.

During the three days, all standard drinks were reduced to £1.50 and the club laid on a wealth of activities and entertainments to mark this auspicious occasion.

“We had a wide range of events going on in the various rooms throughout the club in

order to get as many people involved as possible,” says Alan, who has held the role of Club Secretary for the past 40 years.

“It’s a great achievement to reach 100 years and the members can be very proud of the club and its history”

“We kicked off the weekend on the Friday with a DJ session from 4pm to 8pm in the Main Bar and that was followed by live music going on in both the Main Bar and the Concert Room. We had music from across a number of decades with songs from the 1940s right up to the present day.

“Members also enjoyed some nostalgic karaoke on the Saturday as well as more live music from a number of artists throughout Sunday. Then on the following Monday afternoon we had a singalong afternoon

with a local artist from 3pm to 8pm – that’s actually a normal Monday for us but it rounded off the Centenary Weekend really well.”

The club also put on some cultural activities during the weekend which reflected the rich history of the club and its members.

One such event saw military expert Scott Knowles give a talk on the Battle of the Somme which has a major resonance for this area with many of the men who fought and died there coming from this area, serving with the ‘Accrington Pals’ as the 11th Battalion of the East Lancashire Regiment was known.

“It was a very poignant talk given that the battle absolutely decimated the area with only 100 of the 1,100 who signed up for the Regiment during the First World War making it home from the war,” says Alan.

Another cultural highlight of the Centenary Weekend was a display of mining artefacts put on by a local museum.

CLUB OF THE MONTH

“Obviously as a miners club, we have a real affinity with the industry,” says Alan. “The club was formed to look after miners given that there were no unions in those days or benefits and it was needed to bring money in for the injured miners who couldn’t work any more.

“So, on the Saturday and Sunday of the Centenary Weekend, the Wood End Mining Museum put on an exhibition over the weekend. Wood End was a local colliery that shut down in the 1950s and they came along with some artefacts, including miners lamps, pickaxes and archive photos.”

The celebrations also reflected the fact that Burnley Miners Club is the biggest consumer in the world of Benedictine, the French herbal liqueur, and even has its own dedicated Benedictine Room.

“We get through around 1,000 bottles a year,” says Alan. “This goes back to the First World War when soldiers from East Lancashire were introduced to Benedictine by monks and they brought it back home with them after the war. It remains a very, very popular drink in the club whether as a ‘Bene ‘n’ Hot’ (Benedictine with hot water) or a ‘Bene Bomb’ (Benedictine and an energy drink).”

Representatives of the company gave a talk during the Centenary Weekend, talking about the history of the drink and giving out free samples to club members.

“We’ve actually run three club trips over to the Benedictine distillery in France over the years and they’ve always made us very welcome,” says Alan.

All in all, the Centenary Weekend was a chance for the club’s hard-working Committee and proud members to reflect on the achievements of a club which continues to thrive in a highly competitive marketplace.

“We’re a very busy club with our turnover around £1 million a year and we have activities going on seven days a week

throughout the year, including live music, snooker and darts,” explains Alan.

“Like many clubs, we’re struggling to compete with pubs on price so we have to keep looking for ways to get different groups of people into the club.

“We work really hard to attract younger people into the club and we’ve found that karaoke is very popular. We now have karaoke every Friday and Saturday and it works well for us.

“Then, for a different audience we have a concert every Sunday afternoon and a band playing covers from the 1950s to 1980s.

“Entertainment is one of our strongest suits and that’s down to the hard work of our Concert Secretary John Chorley who has been doing the job for 20 years and knows every act on the circuit.

“We’re very close – about a quarter of a mile - to Burnley FC’s Turf Moor ground so home matches are really busy for us. It’s great that Burnley have done so well in the Premier League. They’ve had a good season and we’ve had a good season on the back of that.

“We show all the main Premier League

games on Sky Sports and BT Sport and when Burnley are playing the club is absolutely packed.

“We’ve also been delighted to welcome other CIU clubs who’ve come up for their teams’ away matches at Turf Moor.

“In fact, we’re a regular stop-off point for coach trips who come in for breakfast with us on their way to the races or other sporting events.

“We have a restaurant which is franchised out and it does extremely well. We also have a separate Function Room which we let for private parties and the restaurant can provide food if required.

“You have to be able to offer all these sorts of things if you want to keep your club profitable.


“We’ll continue to look at new things as we go forward so here’s to the next hundred years of Burnley Miners Club!”

CORCA forges links with gaming industry



CORCA (the Committee of Registered Club Associations) has embarked on a programme of co-operation with BACTA which represents the UK's amusement machine industry

BACTA, the trade association which represents the UK's amusement machine industry, and CORCA, the Committee of Registered Club Associations (of which the CIU is a leading member), have agreed an informal programme of co-operation on matters of mutual interest, following a meeting between senior representatives of the two organisations.

Facilitated by Dransfields Managing Director, Chris Haley, who also serves as BACTA Treasurer, the meeting was chaired by Lord Smith of Hindhead, CBE, Chief Executive of the Association of Conservative Clubs (ACC) and a member of the Lords' Select Committee which undertook a review of the Licensing Act 2003

Talking about the meeting, BACTA Chief Executive, John White, said: "Our aim is to build on our relationship with the club sector, part of the industry that many BACTA members know well and are active in.

"Chris Haley and myself were given the opportunity to talk about BACTA and the initiatives that we are undertaking across a range of topics and issues.

"The FOBT political lobbying campaign that we have been driving alongside a myriad of social, religious and cultural groups was of significant interest to our colleagues at CORCA as was our commitment to social responsibility and the work we are undertaking with the PPL on music licensing, specifically the legal status of using personal licenses to stream background music in-venue.

"There are circa 107,000 gaming and

amusements machines sited in UK clubs and pubs and it is important for the principal trade bodies to maintain an open dialogue and in the process establish a close and productive working relationship based on the exchange of information, knowledge and insight."

BACTA achieved a notable success in May with the announcement that the maximum stake on fixed-odds betting terminals (FOBTs) in betting shops will be reduced to £2 under new rules unveiled by the Government, a policy for which the organisation has long campaigned.

Under the current laws, people can go into a betting shop and bet up to £100 every 20 seconds on electronic games such as roulette.

The Government's FOBT announcement, which was made by Matt Hancock, the Minister for Culture, Media and Sport, on May 17, was welcomed by BACTA.

In a statement following the Government announcement, it said: "We warmly welcome this announcement. A stake reduction to £2 has long been needed to protect consumers from the harm caused by FOBTs.

"This is a decision that puts player protection first, and will allow the gambling industry as a whole to move forwards and create a safer, more socially responsible environment for consumers.

"It is a testament to the wide-ranging campaign for stake reduction from concerned individuals and organisations across politics, public health and the wider gaming sector.

"The Government has made the right decision and it now needs to be implemented without delay."

Clubs urged to help recruit MPs to the All-Party Parliamentary Group

The All-Party Parliamentary Group (APPG) For Non Profit Making Members' Clubs, which meets quarterly at Westminster, is currently undertaking a major recruitment exercise.

They have written to all 650 MPs outlining the role of the APPG and inviting new members to join their ranks.

The secretariat and administrative function of the APPG is undertaken by the Union and Head Office Manager Stephen Goulding comments: "We understand the importance of our voice being heard in Parliament and our clubs' interests being represented and protected.

"The most effective way to do this is by having a strong Parliamentary Group to lobby both the Government and Opposition members.

"You can help. Please contact your local MP and let them know the important role your club plays in the community and even invite them along to an event taking place at your club."

He continues: "The more MPs who know about us and speak for us, the better."

ACM education sessions to be run on regional basis at clubs

A timetable is currently being drawn up for the rollout of the Union's new Award in Club Management (ACM) which was launched during Conference Weekend in April.

The new qualification, which has been developed by the CIU's Education Committee working in tandem with CPL Training, is called the Award in Club Management (ACM).

The course consists of three self-contained units, each taking one day of classroom-based study to complete.

Unit 1A of the course covers Law & Regulation, Licensing. Unit 1B covers Other Law and Regulations. Unit 2 covers the topics of Management, Finance and Administration.

Candidates will get an understanding of licensing law and regulation relating to members' clubs, as well as a whole host of other laws and regulations that govern the running of a club, including entertainment, the various copyright permissions required, the rules and regulations surrounding gaming machines in clubs.

The new qualification will also enable candidates to get an understanding of the main issues of financial management and administration of clubs and how to ensure that you keep your club afloat financially.



The Union's new Award in Club Management (ACM) was launched during Conference Weekend in April and will be rolled out in October/November

Once a candidate has completed the course and been examined in all three units, they will receive the ACM diploma.

The course is open to all CIU members but is specifically aimed at people who are going to be sitting on club committees and occupying positions of authority within clubs for the first time.

The ACM is designed to make education more accessible to Union members with each unit designed to be completed in separate one-day sessions with a multiple

choice test of 30 questions to complete at the end of the session.

These one-day courses will be held at clubs in different regions to cut down on the need for candidates to travel long distances to attend.

Course literature has been produced and this will be sent to candidates ahead of their attendance.

The first day courses are set to be held in October/November and a full timetable will be published in the *Journal*.


