Blackpool '19: NEC agrees motion to be debated at Annual Meeting

In April, Blackpool will once again host the Union's Conference Weekend which will see club delegates from all over the country attending the Annual Meeting on Saturday, April 13 at the Norbreck Castle Hotel as well as the 28th CIU Beer & Trades Exhibition which takes place on Friday, April 12 at the same venue.

The National Executive Committee (NEC) has agreed the following motion to be debated at the Annual Meeting:

Motion: A compulsory annually renewable associate/affiliation card will be supplied to all club members at a price of £3 plus VAT. To be distributed as follows:- £1.50 to central funds, 80p to branch funds and 70p to the club. The club's annual fee to be a flat £100 plus VAT; £50 to central funds and £50 to branch funds.

If passed at Conference the following references in the Constitution will be amended: Rule 16 (a) - (b) - (d) - (e) - (f) - (g).

Meanwhile, many further suppliers have signed up to exhibit at this year's Beer &

Trades Exhibition.

Several companies, including BT Sport, Chemisphere, Cameo Curtains, Club Control, Nationwide Energy, Utility Tri and Global Brands have all confirmed their attendance at the event alongside Preferred Suppliers Aon, Heineken UK and Dransfields.

The CIU will also have its own stand at the trade show with information available on all the services offered to clubs by the Union, including details of the new Award in Club Management (ACM).

"Conference Weekend is the highlight of the Union calendar and we're delighted to once again be staging both key events – the Annual Meeting and the Beer & Trades Exhibition – at the Norbreck Castle Hotel," said Union General Secretary Kenneth D Green CMD.

"I look forward to meeting club members from up and down the country as we come together for debate and to shape the future of the Union."

OSSETT CENTRAL CLUB, WEST YORKSHIRE

Ossett Central Club in West Yorkshire has been serving its local community for well over a century and continues to offer its members a fantastic all-round experience every day of the week

Where there were once six Working Mens Club in the small market town of Ossett, on the outskirts of Wakefield in West Yorkshire, there is now just one: the Ossett Central Club, which has been serving the local community for well over a century.

While nearby clubs may have sadly fallen by the wayside over the years, the Central Club is not faltering and continues to demonstrate that well-run clubs can look to the future with confidence.

“We’re doing really well at the moment and we’ve really moved forward in the past few years,” says Club President John Musgrave.

“About three years ago we had a change of structure in the club when the previous Steward left and we employed a new Bar Manager, Leslie Brooke.

“This change has seen the club go from strength to strength since then and she is doing a great job in helping the Committee

try new things that will ensure the club continues to flourish.

“We’ve gone from taking £6,000 a week to £8,000 a week in that time and that has enabled us to invest in the club facilities to ensure that the club continues to be a comfortable and modern place which members enjoying coming to.

“We refurbished our Lounge, we’ve revamped all the lighting on our stage in the Concert Room and the place is really busy all year round.”

Part of the appeal is the wide-ranging live entertainment offered by the club with the club seeing out high-quality acts on a weekly basis.

“Live entertainment is a really big part of what we do with artists performing every Saturday and Sunday,” says John.

“Quite recently we’ve started putting on a tribute act on the last Friday of every month and that has gone down brilliantly with our members.

“Our Concert Room has a capacity of 180 and it has been heaving for the Friday tribute nights. We’ve had Cher, Frankie Valli and Michael Jackson tributes so far this year and they have all been sold out.

“But equally, we also book some great non-tribute acts for the weekend slots. We normally have a duo or band on a Saturday and a solo artist on a Sunday night.”

Indeed, Sundays are a particularly busy time for the club.

“There’s always a good atmosphere on a Sunday and that is helped by the presence of our football team. They were an existing team whose home pitch is just down the road from the club and they approached us to become incorporated into our club which our Committee agreed to.

“It’s been a huge benefit to both sides with a flow of younger members into the club and the team having somewhere to meet after games. For home games on Sundays, they bring the away team with them back

into the club for drinks and normally stay for the afternoon to watch the live football in our bar.

“We are very much a club for everyone and we aim to look after our members whatever their age. We have members right across the spectrum from 18 year olds to 80-something year olds who use the club on a regular basis.”

Of course, the club’s continuing vibrancy has not come about by accident and is down to the hard work being done behind the scenes by the club’s Committee.

“We have a very active and hard working Committee of 12, including Susan Spence, who has been doing a great job as Secretary for the past six years,” says John.

“Like many members’ clubs, we struggle to get new blood on to the Committee but we’re hoping to encourage more members to get involved with the day-to-day running of the club so you have a succession plan in place going forward.

“I’ve been involved on the Committee since 1999 and spent seven years as Vice-President, working alongside the then President, picking his brains and gaining experience before taking on my current role as President and I think that sort of ‘apprenticeship’ in running a club is very important.”

Also important to the club’s success is a well-priced bar with a great selection of drinks and the Central Club certainly does not disappoint on that score.

“John Smith’s is our biggest seller at £2.40 a pint, closely followed by Carling, while gin has become a massive seller for the club too,” says John.

“We now have nine different types of gin available at the bar and a variety of different mixers and ‘serves’ and it is proving really popular.

“We’re not tied to any one supplier. Many years ago, we paid our brewery loans off and it was the best move we ever made as it really strengthens our negotiating hand with our suppliers and means we can get the best possible prices for our members at the bar.”

The club also earns some valuable revenue from hiring out the Concert Room for private functions and other activities.

“We hire the Concert Room out whenever we can for private functions, including parties and wakes,” says John.

“We also have line dancing every Wednesday night and a monthly flower arranging club and this all helps to bring income into the club.”

The mainstays of snooker, bingo and darts all take place at the club throughout the week with many other events being staged throughout the year.

“We’re still a traditional, community-focused club; for example, we still run an annual trip for senior citizens and take them down to the seaside,” says John.

“Every year we organise a show for the local community and host a number of special charity events.

“On March 19, we’re hosting the Dewsbury Ambulance Charities Night at the club which is where they do a number of presentations for the people who have supported the charity over the previous year. It’s an annual event which is always a very entertaining night.”

But while tradition is important to the Central Club, they are eager to try new things in order to keep the club moving forward.

“We’re not afraid to adapt to the modern world and make sure that the club is moving with the times,” says John. “You can’t just keep doing things the way you were 20, 30 or 40 years ago.

“Sometimes innovations can cause a bit of friction but you have to adapt or you can fall by the wayside as many other clubs have done in our area and beyond.”

Naturally, running a long-established members’ club in the modern era is not without its challenges.

“Our biggest problem is the upkeep of what is a very old building,” says John.

“Last year we had to replace the roof and the year before that we spent £12,000 on refurbishing the toilets, two major investments. But spending money on the club just has to be done as you want a club which the members are proud to be associated with.

“We are renowned in the area for being a very friendly and safe place to come for a drink,” he continues.

“We have a longstanding zero tolerance policy towards troublemakers and deal with any occurrences of anti-social behaviour – as rare as they may be – very swiftly.

“It makes for a great atmosphere. We have the multi-room Sky Sports package in the club so we can make sure our members can see the live sport they want even then there’s a fixture clash.

“We have a good following for the Premier League matches and the Super League rugby is also very popular.

“The live Super League games are on Thursday nights, Friday nights and Saturday afternoons and we have plenty of Leeds Rhinos and Wakefield Trinity fans amongst our membership which makes for great, good-hearted banter whenever those two are playing each other!”

MEMBERS' CORNER

Informative articles which affect our life

by Dione Mobley

If you have an interest in photography and happen to be in London in the next couple of months, a new exhibition has opened featuring the work of one of Britain's greatest living photojournalists, Don McCullin. A selection of his work will be on display till May 5 at the Tate Britain.

The black and white photographs in the exhibition were all produced and printed by the photographer himself from his dark room at home in Somerset.

Born in 1935 the photographer came from Finsbury Park, North London, quite close to the Union offices. Growing up in an impoverished neighbourhood after World War II, he left school with no qualifications aged just 15.

After serving abroad in the RAF he returned to England and bought his first camera, a twin reflex Rolleicord.

His future career started almost by accident when the picture editor from the Observer newspaper saw his photographs featuring a former local Finsbury gang known as "The Guvnors" in 1959 and secured them for the newspaper.

Over the years he worked for several other papers and during his illustrious career McCullin took enormous risks and faced many dangers to his own life on photo assignments.

His best known photographs are his celebrated war portraits from battle zones all over the world, including Vietnam, Northern Ireland and Yemen, which over the years gained him many awards.

Now retired at age 83, McCullin is still taking pictures - not of war these days but quieter scenes of rural landscapes where he lives with his family in the countryside.

For those who have a keen interest in photography or world history this is a very special collection from a photo journalist who has travelled the world and documented many significant moments through the art of photography.




