Union calls for clarity on Licensing Act interpretations

The CIU is urging the Home Office to give guidance to licensing authorities in the UK on how they deal with private members' clubs.

There has been a wave of complaints from Union clubs in some areas about the way they are dealt with by their local licensing authorities with interpretations of the Licensing Act seemingly varying from area to area, making it difficult for clubs to get definitive advice on any problems that may occur.

Speaking at the most recent All-Party Parliamentary Group for Non-Profit Making Members' Clubs at the Houses of Parliament in October, Ken Green CMD, the Union's General Secretary, said: "The Union has found that a lot of individual licensing authorities have different interpretations of the Licensing Act.

"As a result, the Union could be advising on one issue in one area but another licensing authority 30 miles away has a different view on it.

"For example, one issue which has come up is regarding guests. The Licensing Act states that guests can be allowed in social clubs and can purchase alcohol. Under the old Licensing Act, and therefore in the old

rules, it restricts guests to two or three and specifically prevents the sale of alcohol to guests.

"The Licensing Act changed but some licensing authorities haven't changed and their officers are threatening our members' clubs with prosecution if they hold weddings or wakes or other functions because guests will be there and may purchase alcohol.

"I'm at a loss at how a licensing authority can prosecute a club against an Act of Parliament."

George Dawson CMD, the Union President, added: "The licensing authorities should recognise that CIU clubs have a proud record of compliance with the licensing conditions and that we as a Union are totally committed to promoting responsible drinking and combating anti-social behaviour.

"If there is a knowledge gap on the part of licensing officers with regards to the differences between private members' clubs and pubs – as there seems to be judging by the reports we've had back from our clubs – the CIU would be very willing to help them understand the differences between the conditions set out for members' clubs in the Licensing Act and those intended for pubs."

CHADDERTON CRICKET & BOWLING CLUB

Chadderton Cricket & Bowling Club in Oldham, Lancashire, has utterly transformed itself in the past 15 years to become a shining example of a truly 21st Century members club with a very bright future

Chadderton Cricket & Bowling Club (CCBC) in Oldham, Lancashire, has come a long way since 1999 when it faced the biggest crisis of its entire existence.

Having served the local community since its foundation at the turn of the 20th Century, the club found itself at its lowest ebb with a ramshackle building, dwindling membership and disastrous finances.

Scroll forward some 15 years and the club is unrecognisable from the one described above with state-of-the-art modern facilities, a fully subscribed membership – plus a lengthy waiting list of potential eager members - and a very healthy bank balance.

Club Secretary Steve Simms explains the transformation in the club's fortunes. "When I joined the Committee - which had previously consisted of just two people – in 1999, it was obvious that something was going wrong," he says.

"Along with like-minded people on the Committee, we decided we weren't going to let the club fizzle out and were going to fight for its future. We came in and took control

of the finances and discovered that the club had lost £29,000 that year.

"That was only part of it as some of the other losses came through in the following year with PAYE, Business Rates, utilities and VAT not having been paid up to date.

“Membership dwindled to 125 but since we built the new clubhouse in 2006 we now have 597 plus a substantial waiting list”

"So there was a big struggle at that time to keep the club going as we had the utility companies threatening to shut off our water and electricity and the local Council chasing for unpaid Council Tax.

"It was a very difficult time so we had to pare all our costs right back across the board and start moving in the right direction. Everything we could economise on, we did. It took until 2004 before the club turned a profit again."

While the reduction in costs helped to steer the club back into the black, the Committee also needed to look at the problem of a rapidly deteriorating building that was increasingly unfit for purpose.

"Around 2001, we started looking at the club site as it was obvious we couldn't keep the site as it was. The building was in disarray," says Steve.

"The building had last been renovated in 1969 and was a bit of a 1960s white elephant with the Club Room on the second floor, the Function Room on the first floor and the main entrance at the rear of the club. It was also very poorly insulated – too hot in summer and freezing in winter – so in the colder months we had to run the massive boiler flat-out."

With a leaking roof and the central heating, electric and plumbing systems all needing total overhauls, the Committee realised that they would not be able to continue keeping the building going and decided to look at selling part of the land owned by the club in order to finance a new building.

"We started talking to developers but at first they either wanted the whole site, which would have left us without a club, or they were coming in with low offers which didn't reflect the true value of the site."

The situation changed for the better when the Committee got in touch with a local architect and began to work with him to map out what they wanted.

"He was a top fella," says Steve. "We sat down with him, told him what we envisaged and he did all the specifications. Then we went out to tender with a plan for knocking down the old club, selling the excess land that the demolition would free up and then building a new club."

"It went extremely well to the extent that we're now one of the wealthiest clubs in the area. We have a substantial balance sheet and we've been making a profit since 2004 but an even greater one since the new club opened in 2006."

"We had about 125 members at our lowest point but people started joining when they heard we were building a new clubhouse with the result that we now have 597 members as well as a substantial waiting list."

"The updated facilities have given the club a new lease of life. We now have a single-story clubhouse with a Lounge, Games Room and a synthetic carpet Crown Green Bowling Green, one of the first in the North-West."

The synthetic Bowling Green enables the club to host bowling all year-round. Indeed, the club runs its own Winter League with 40 teams from around the area applying to join the league, with all games played at CCBC.

Despite the club name, CCBC has not run a cricket side for many years but sports enthusiasts have plenty to occupy them with darts, pool and snooker teams in regular action. The club pays all sport team league fees on the agreement that if the team should happen to win a prize it is shared 50:50 with the club.

There is also a full programme of activities and entertainment laid on at regular intervals, including live music and bingo on Saturdays and karaoke on Sundays.

"We're a members club, run by members for the members," explains Steve. "We don't have a function room and we don't hire the premises out."

Prospective new members have to be proposed by an existing member and are then interviewed by the Committee before their application is accepted.

"Entry is by the fob system and members like the fact that they can come through the door and enjoy the excellent facilities provided for them amongst fellow members," says Steve.

It's clear that the hard work and vision of the club's Committee has ensured that after some dark days, CCBC is now a shining example of a truly 21st Century club.

It's worth spending a moment thinking about your club's insurance issues during the busy festive period

Q Christmas is likely to be a really busy time in our club so are there any particular insurance issues we should be looking at when it comes to the festive period?

We all know that clubs are self-policing. Nevertheless, as the festive season gets underway, it's wise to take precautionary measures.

So how do you protect yourself against late night revellers and just what does your insurance cover?

Here are some of the sensible steps that you can take now to try to prevent any insurance claims you may need to make being refused, causing disruption to club business.

When accidents happen

You should have a clear statement of your

health and safety policy, risk assessments, alongside an accident reporting and investigation system.

This should help you reduce any Public Liability claims and help defend against them.

Had a bit too much?

Intoxicated members are far more likely to injure themselves or others, resulting in a Public Liability claim.

Remember, just because an individual is intoxicated doesn't necessarily mean they cannot allege negligence against you in court.

The safe option is to stop serving people alcohol before they have that éone too many.

Theft by employees

At this time of year you could be holding significantly more money in the safe than usual, which may be more of a temptation for unscrupulous employees.

If a theft occurs, insurers will ask for the

written references of the staff member in question. Remember, you will need written references on record for any authorised official or employee with access to both club monies and stock.


