CIU submits evidence to House of Lords Committee examining Licensing laws



The CIU has submitted evidence to a House of Lords Committee which is examining the Licensing Act 2003

The CIU has supplied a response to the House of Lords Committee which is currently examining the Licensing Act 2003.

The House of Lords Committee is investigating the effectiveness of the Act and will publish its report early in 2017 after receiving evidence from a number of organisations.

The CIU's written submission concerned three specific areas covered by the Licensing Act 2003 – Temporary Event Notices (TENs), Licensing Fees and Minimum Unit Pricing.

On the subject of TENs, the CIU statement said: "A frequently voiced concern of Club Secretaries and CIU officers and officials is the inconsistent and arbitrary application of some provisions of the Act by local licensing officers.

"Some clubs complain of licensing officers applying arbitrary constraints in regard to TENs contrary to the provision of the Act and Home Office statutory guidance under Section 182; for example, locally determined requirements as to who in the club context may sign a TEN, and arbitrary limits on the number of TENs a single individual can sign.

"The Section 182 statutory guidance to licensing authorities purports to be 'a key

medium for promoting best practice (and) ensuring consistent application of licensing powers'. It makes clear to regulators that any individual over age 18 may give a TEN provided, in the case of non-personal licence holders, that no individual does so on more than five occasions in a calendar year.

"Admittedly there are numerous quantitative limits governing TENs in the Act which require to be assimilated.

"However regulators should be cognisant of what the Act says and pay heed to the Section 182 guidance which exists to assist them in applying the law and exercising their functions uniformly."

Regarding Licensing Fees, the CIU set out the case for them to continue to be set at a national level to promote uniformity and consistency across all licensing authorities.

The CIU statement also called for Minimum Unit Pricing to be introduced in England and for regulations regarding irresponsible drinks promotions to be equally applied to off-sales as it currently is to on-sales.

Chaired by Baron McIntosh of Pickering, the Committee also includes Lord Smith of Hindhead CBE, the Chief Executive of the Association of Conservative Clubs and Chairman of CORCA.

Green light for new Flockton Green WMC building

Flockton Workmens Club in Wakefield will soon have a brand-new building to call home after a proposal to build housing on its current site was passed by the local council.

Kirklees Council's strategic planning committee gave the go-ahead to demolish the existing club and replace it with a new clubhouse along with 87 homes.

The club agreed a deal with Barratt and David Wilson Homes to sell its land in exchange for a new club building to replace the current outdated premises.

Secretary Harry Marsden has pledged that the club's historic clock, which was restored only two years ago having been originally purchased by the club in 1918 to commemorate the end of World War One, would take pride of place in the new premises.

The project will see new houses built on

land currently occupied by the clubhouse and on fields behind it and next to a nearby school.

The new clubhouse will be situated just a few yards away, while football pitches and a cricket ground associated with the club will remain untouched by the construction project.

The new club house will have a large function room and a club room with a games area, plus a central bar serving both rooms.

In addition, there will be a two-bedroom steward's accommodation on the first floor of the building.

Architects behind the plan say the more contemporary appearance will "create a landmark building within the village" whilst taking influences from the existing club building, such as its clock face.

South East Midlands Branch Angling Results 2016

This competition has been running on an annual basis since 2000 and in those 16 years has been graced by some of the country's top quizzers, many of whom have gone on to feature in top TV quiz shows, including *Eggheads*, *Who Wants To Be A Millionaire?* and *Mastermind*.

Details of dates and venues for the Regional Heats will be sent out to all clubs this month and will also be published in the next issue of *Club Journal*.

The regions hosting the Heats are: Yorkshire, South Wales, North East, Lancashire, South East and the Midlands.

The top three placed teams from each Heat will go through to the Final to be held at the Norbreck Castle Hotel in Blackpool in April 2017, while the first-placed team from each Heat will receive £100 prize money.

The prize money for the Final will be £500 for the champions; £250 for the runners-up and £100 for the third-placed team.

As for the past two years, specialists Redtooth UK will be running the quiz with renowned quizmaster Dave Bill once again setting questions which are guaranteed to be as entertaining as they are challenging.

Newbottle 'A' from Newbottle WMC in Tyne & Wear are the current Dransfields CIU National Quiz Champions after clinching the title at the 2016 Final in Blackpool.

In the end, there was just three points separating the top three teams with Newbottle WMC achieving 68 points, just ahead of 2015 Champions Gosforth Empire Social Club on 67 points and Clarence 'A' on 65 points.

YOUR LETTERS

A recent letter on the subject of entertainment agents from a Mr Eddie Murphy in Openshaw, Manchester, led to much debate in clubland about the relative merits – or not – of booking acts through an agent. Here, we publish two of the responses we received on this highly contentious issue

This letter is a response to Mr Murphy's comments in the September issue of *Club Journal*. As a former Concert Secretary and Club President I would like to say how misinformed he is with regard to what Concert Secretaries and Agents actually do.

He is correct in saying that clubs are not as well-attended as they used to be but how typical it is to blame the artistes and agents.

There are many factors causing the decline in Working Men's Clubs (the title is one of them) but I would suggest that Mr Murphy's attitude is the major cause. Does Mr Murphy still watch a black and white television and drive a Morris Minor?

The world has moved on and clubs must adapt or die. Drummers and organists are a thing of the past. A modern electronic keyboard can produce backing drums and much more.

A laptop computer can store and replay thousands of high-quality backing tracks, indeed some of them are the backing tracks used in the studio when the original recordings were made.

This enables artistes to adapt their act to all kinds of audiences with a wide range of music – something to suit everyone's taste. Artistes who play their own music are still available if that's your preference.

In the past Concert Secretaries would tour other clubs to audition new acts for their club. The internet has changed that approach. Agents' and artistes' websites allow an act to be sampled easily and conveniently.

In my five years as a Concert Secretary our club's agent never refused to book an act I requested and was only too pleased to discuss with me the type of acts that our club wanted. Agents do take a percentage of commission from the artistes' fee, typically 15 percent, but for that they do their best to guarantee artistes work week-in and week-out. For many artistes this is their sole

means of income and not just a bit of pin money.

Moreover agents also provide a back-up. If for any reason an artiste fails to arrive at the venue a simple phone call can find out why and if necessary arrange a substitute at short notice. Far better than a club with no act on a Saturday night!

I believe I am very lucky to be a member of two well attended and successful clubs in Brighouse, West Yorkshire.

Like many other members I have put in considerable time and effort to ensure the success and enjoyment all our members continue to enjoy.

I would suggest to Mr Murphy that perhaps he should take on the role of Concert Secretary for a while. I am sure his point of view would be somewhat different.

Agents are totally unreliable and keep supplying us with rubbish. Therefore they are not increasing our footfall into our club and we might as well just throw the cash on the streets!

SPOTLIGHT ON... GEOFF BLAKELEY CMD

We talk to Manchester Branch Secretary and NEC Member Geoff Blakeley CMD on his life in clubs which began when he joined Lamberhead Green WMC in Wigan at the age of 18

Q: How did you become involved with clubs and the CIU?

I joined Lamberhead Green Working Mens Club in Wigan at the age of 18 and went on to the Committee in 1978 after being put forward by the President and Secretary. In 1986 I became the Assistant Secretary of the club and then became Secretary in 1991, a position I've held ever since. I joined the Branch Committee in 1994 and became Branch Secretary in 2004, a position I still hold. I became a member of the National Executive Committee in 2007.

Q: How are Manchester Branch clubs generally faring at the moment?

The ones that are still open are doing okay and holding their own. It's simply a case of keeping track of surpluses and deficits and those that can maintain the positive balances will continue to operate.

Q: If the Prime Minister offered you three wishes on behalf of clubs, what would they be?

Clubs should definitely benefit more from rate relief because of what they do for their communities. Secondly, that the Government doesn't return to the beer duty escalator which really had a detrimental effect on clubs. The recent cuts to beer duty have really helped us. Thirdly, I'd like the Government to have more understanding of members clubs and give more leeway on regulation. Our clubs exist to serve their members and their local communities but all too often in legislative terms we're lumped in with pubs which only exist to make a profit. As well as raising millions for charity every year, our clubs also support local charities and community groups by providing them with somewhere to hold their meetings and it's about time our contribution to society was recognised by the Government.

Q: What are your key aspirations for clubs in the year ahead?

I hope that any clubs which are experiencing problems approach their branch sooner rather than later. We've had instances in the past where clubs have not asked for assistance until it's too late to save the club. The Branch Executive is there to help and will look at every conceivable angle in order to help a struggling club. Most of the time, if we know about the

problems early enough, we can give very valuable advice that can prevent a club from closing. I'm also very hopeful that the Union can undertake a big recruitment drive to get currently unregistered clubs to join the CIU and benefit greatly from being part of the organisation. In addition, I'd like to see more clubs making their lives easier by using IT more effectively.

Q: You're on the NEC's Education Committee - how is the new course progressing?

We've undertaken two pilots for the new Award in Club Management and the finishing touches are being done at the moment which means it should be launching in the New Year.

Q: You've also been involved with getting the message out to clubs on the Auto-enrolment Pension legislation

I travelled to clubs all over the country to help club officials get to grips with the new legislation and hopefully that spurred many of them on to comply and avoid fines. Changing legislation is a fact of life but clubs can always go to their branch to receive help and guidance on the new requirements.

Q: If you could award an OCE (Order of the Club Empire) who would it be to and why?

I would give it to any person who has served as a club official for over 30 years as that is a huge part of your life you've devoted to your club.

Q: Who has been the biggest influence in your club life?

Definitely my wife and family as they've been a massive support to me over the years.

PRS releases new tariff for Members' Clubs

PRS For Music has released its latest tariff for Members' Clubs.

One of the benefits of being part of the CIU is that the Union has negotiated a special discount for its clubs with PRS For Music, the organisation which collects and distributes licence fees for the use of music on behalf of songwriters, composers and performers.

The PRS licence covers music played through radios, CDs, streaming on the internet, music on television and also live music performance.

The new tariff is enclosed with this month's issue.

Last year, CIU President George Dawson CMD issued the following advice to clubs regarding PRS For Music Licences :

“Clubs should always keep a detailed record of previous licence charges made to PRS as the tariff for non-profit making

members' clubs can be very complicated.


“It is well worth scrutinising the tariff to ensure your club is not paying over the odds for music.

“If you receive a phone call from PRS requesting a payment and want to make sure you're being charged the correct amount, I would advise you to ask them for a hard copy of the charges to be sent to you by post so that you can examine them in detail and seek advice if required.

“There is a myriad of factors which determine how much clubs will pay.

“Indeed, there are several pages of notes covering the various scenarios in the Members' Clubs tariff supplied by PRS so it is advisable for club officials to arm themselves with as much knowledge of the system and scenarios as possible when working out the annual fee.”

INTERVIEW: KERRY DIXON

Club Journal Editor Stephen Goulding talks to former Chelsea and England striker Kerry Dixon about his glory days as a player in the 1980s, including a place in the 1986 World Cup squad in Mexico, and his later struggles with gambling and drug addiction which resulted in a stint in prison. Dixon has recounted the highs and lows of his extraordinary life in his newly published autobiography *Up Front*

Stephen Goulding: In media interviews and in your book you come across as being very open and honest about your struggle to come to terms with life after football

Kerry Dixon: That's right. What's the point of writing a book if you're not going to be honest about your life? I'm not saying that every part of my life has been right – I don't believe that anyone's is. Everyone has regrets and experienced highs and lows and I'm no exception.

SG: You were an outstanding goalscorer during your playing career but your career peaked just before the really big money came into the game. Do you have regrets about that?

KD: I left Chelsea in 1992 which was the year the Premier League was formed and I then spent seven months at Southampton and then two and a half years at Luton Town so I would say that I did miss out on the 'gravy train'.

SG: It's absolutely incredible how much Premier League clubs are now paying their players, even peripheral players or ones out on loan. Look at your old club Chelsea, for example, who have 38 players out on loan this season

KD: Well, the thing about putting players out on loan is that if just one or two homegrown Chelsea players who are currently out on loan eventually make the grade and get into the first team, you've justified the investment in the Academy. I think the loan system is necessary for young players as they have to learn to play with men and it's better than playing for U21 or U23 sides. For a young player to play in a competitive league like the Championship or even to go on loan to another team in the Premier League is a great way to learn the game, improve as a player and perhaps return and develop into a first team player.

SG: What about the physical development of players? You were a big, physical striker but

do you think size is important for the modern player?

KD: Definitely not. I think if you're good enough, you're big enough! Look at Dennis Wise who was not a big man at all but played for many years in the midfield at Chelsea with great success. Or look at the Barcelona attack who make up for lack of stature with skill.

SG: Looking at your England career, do you have any regrets that you didn't get more opportunities to play for your country?

KD: I played eight times for England but had the misfortune to be up against a number of good English strikers in that era like Gary Lineker and Peter Beardsley. I actually shared the First Division Golden Boot award with Lineker during the 194/85 season, both of us scoring 24 goals. But an England cap is something to be revered and I really value my eight appearances and four goals for my country. I've still got all eight caps which I received and they'll be handed down to my children.

SG: And are you still aiming to be involved with football going forward? You've had a lot of experience in the game and in life, both bad and good, and it seems a shame if that knowledge is not put to use somehow


KD: Well, at the age of 55 I think coaching has passed me by but I'd still like to be involved with the game in some capacity. With the experiences I've had in life I know that no matter how much a footballer earns there are still dangers out there. Richer people than me have fallen from grace and from far loftier positions. I believe that whatever happens to a person in terms of addictions, etc you have to deal with it yourself. In my era, you'd see players hit hard times but while they were still playing and earning money, football generally acted as a buffer and ensured they'd be okay. But when you hang up your boots and the money's no longer there, you can really come unstuck.

SG: Do you think the footballing authorities do enough to help players who may be experiencing 'life' problems?

KD: I think they try but I really do believe it's got to come from within. You've got to take back control of yourself. It's what I'm trying to do after my well-documented struggles with my addictions. Only time will tell if I can achieve what I'm trying to do. I saw this book as writing a line under what's gone before and hopefully I have plenty of years to achieve more and perhaps put something positive back into football. I've got to do what I can now to pay the bills, keep myself right and live the life of a normal person.

SG: So, looking back on your playing career, are there any particular moments which stand out for you?

KD: The goal for Chelsea in the one-all draw against Arsenal at Highbury on the first day of the 1984 First Division season certainly stands out as a great day. Not just for my goal {a right-footed volley past Arsenal goalkeeper Pat Jennings} but for what it meant for the 20,000 Chelsea fans who were packed into the Clock End of the ground. Whenever I talk to a Chelsea fan they always mention that goal and most of them claim to have been there!







MEMBERS' CORNER

Recently there have been more reports in the media highlighting the dangers of 'Cash for Crash' scams operated by large networks of organised criminal gangs.

These scams work when vehicles become the target of fraudsters. Driving on a motorway or just approaching a roundabout are areas where drivers need to be extra vigilant and careful. On a busy motorway the gangs usually will work in teams while driving.

The gang will proceed to place a vehicle in front of the target and a team vehicle behind in order to force the collision. This could result in multiple vehicles being involved with serious injuries to others and large claims put forward for insurance compensation.

Scam accidents also happen on quieter roads when suddenly, a car in front of another driver slams on their brakes, for no obvious reason, giving the driver behind no time to stop to avoid a collision. At the scene the other driver

insists it is the target victim's fault and quickly gives their name and address with details for their vehicle insurance.

Then, a few weeks later the victim will receive a notice from the insurance company notifying them of an exaggerated claim.

This may include the added costs for a recovery vehicle, car hire, lost wages and accompanied by claims for doctors medical expenses or whiplash injuries to passengers at the time.

Some precautions drivers can take include having a small dashboard camera installed. These small devices are not very expensive and very easily fitted into any make or model of vehicle. They can be extremely useful in tracking and recording information, especially if you are later notified to appear in court.

Many of these gangs have all their insurance details already written down on a piece of paper before an accident even happens. If you are involved in an accident always try to note as much information as possible.



THE CIU: SERVING THE NEEDS OF CLUBS

Union President George Dawson CMD looks at the benefits to clubs of being part of the CIU, which for over 150 years has been ensuring that its members have all the tools they need to survive and flourish

“ It’s clear that, 154 years after it was founded, the CIU continues to be an organisation which fulfils a vital function for its member clubs and in turn for the local communities which they serve.

As the largest non-profit making social entertainment and leisure organisation in the UK, the CIU is able to give our clubs a voice at national level and ensure that the concerns of our many millions of members are being communicated effectively and regularly to those at the highest levels of government.

We also provide a full range of services to our member clubs, not least in the vitally important area of education. Since 1934, the Union’s Club Management Diploma (CMD) has equipped club men and women with the knowledge of best practice in such areas as Club Law, Book-Keeping and Financial Control.

Our Education Programme continues to evolve and later this year we’ll be rolling out our new Award in Club Management qualification.

This new course has already been piloted in various areas of the country and will help to make our Education Programme even more accessible to our members as they strive to run their clubs with maximum efficiency.

We also provide a framework which recognises the hard work and dedication that goes on week-in, week-out in clubs and our official magazine, *Club Journal*, is filled with

those who are celebrating milestones in service to their clubs or branches and have earned Certificates of Merit and Long Service Awards. We have also recently reintroduced Long Service Gold Medals and Bars to mark these milestones.

And the benefits of being a CIU-affiliated club do not end there, with clubs able to draw on the Union’s full resources whenever a problem arises or some help is needed when dealing with a regulatory, licensing or HR issue.

Your local Branch Secretary is the first port of call for any such queries and, if needs be, these can be referred on to Head Office for further help.

Another benefit that our clubs enjoy is a special tariff for a PRS for Music (formerly Performing Rights Society) licence, something which can save a considerable amount of money for clubs over the year.

Head Office also has a dedicated Rules Department which deals with all matters relating to rules on behalf of clubs, branches and the Union.

It will prepare all rule changes for the approval of club members, the registration with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) and the printing through the Union’s printer. All this work is carried out by the department free of charge.

The same department also deals with clubs’ affiliation to the Union. Incidentally, we have

also recently produced a generic Rules Book for unregistered clubs and hope that this will help any such clubs who do not currently belong to our Union or other club associations.

Being part of the CIU also enables clubs to get involved with our thriving sports and games competitions at both a National and Branch level and many professional darts, snooker and pool players have honed their skills in the games rooms of our clubs.

There are also many events throughout the year which members of CIU clubs can attend, including the Beer & Trades Exhibition which takes place during our Annual Conference weekend in Blackpool each April.

Each November we stage the annual CIU Charity Raceday at Wetherby Racecourse in Yorkshire, with around 2,000 members from right across the country enjoying a great day out.

We believe that being part of the CIU has many advantages and we are constantly striving to add to the benefits which our clubs enjoy.”

WHAT CAN THE CIU DO FOR YOUR CLUB?

We take an in-depth look at the many services and benefits offered by the CIU to its affiliated clubs, including legal advice, the chance to learn about club law and finance through the Union's Education Programme and the opportunity to take part in sports competitions at both National and Branch level

Advice and help for Clubs

Affiliated clubs can take advantage of the resources of the CIU through their local Branch Secretary and from Head Office with assistance offered in legal proceedings where matters of club principles are involved. The Union has also produced a series of contracts and handbooks which take in the current legislative requirements, including the Club Secretary Handbook which is regularly updated to include the most recent changes to employment law. The Union also runs an Arbitration Training programme to assist club officials.

Club Journal

Club Journal is the Union's official monthly magazine and is a must-read for CIU members. Each month the magazine features news from around the branches, club profiles, opinion columns from leading Union figures, business-building advice from the experts, sporting news and results, plus details of the CIU Racing Club discounts available to members and regular competitions. Each affiliated club receives one free copy of the monthly magazine while an annual subscription costs £7.50 and gives you 12 copies for the price of 10.

Education

The Union's Club Management Diploma (CMD) and residential Club Law and Club Finance weekends give officials the chance to learn everything they need to know to run their clubs with maximum efficiency. The CMD was established in 1934 and covers club law, administration, book-keeping and accountancy. In addition, the Union is set to launch a new Award in Club Management in the latter half of 2016 which underlines the Union's aim to make education even more accessible to its members.

PRS for Music tariff

The CIU has negotiated a special discount for its clubs with the PRS for Music (PRS) which collects and distributes licence fees for the use of music on behalf of songwriters, composers and performers. The PRS licence covers music played through radios, CDs, streaming on the internet, music on TVs and also live music performances. The tariff for Members' Clubs is printed annually and placed as an insert in the *Club Journal* while it can also be downloaded from the CIU website: www.wmciu.org.uk

Charity

CIU clubs are at the forefront of raising funds for an array of national and local charities with members getting involved in a range of activities – from charity darts marathons and sponsored bike rides to special fundraising concerts and entertainment nights. As well as countless local charities, many national charities continue to benefit from CIU events that are held throughout the year at our clubs, including Macmillan Cancer Support, Diabetes UK, the Alzheimers Society and the Poppy Appeal.

Lobbying on behalf of clubs

Union officials have been at the forefront of helping shape legislation across a number of areas of crucial importance to clubs through the CIU's involvement with the All-Party Parliamentary Group for Non-Profit Making Private Members' Clubs. This group, which meets quarterly at Westminster, gives the Union direct access to both Members of Parliament and Peers from right across the political spectrum. The CIU also plays a leading role in representing its members through the Committee of Registered Clubs Associations (CORCA).





Rules

The CIU Rules Department deals with all matters relating to rules on behalf of clubs, the Union and the Branches. The preparation of all rule changes for the approval of the club members, the registration with the Financial Conduct Authority (FCA) and the printing through the Union's printer, are all dealt with in the Department at Head Office. The Department also deals with clubs' affiliation to the Union. The Union has also produced a Generic Rules Book especially to help clubs which are currently unregistered to the CIU or other associations.

Events – CIU National Charity Raceday

Dransfields CIU National Charity Raceday is an annual event, held at Wetherby Racecourse in November. This is one of the highlights of the CIU calendar and the 2015 event saw 1,750 Union members heading to Yorkshire to enjoy a fantastic day out as they raised £3,500 for the CIU's Education Programme. There is always a great atmosphere in the CIU marquee, situated next to the Winners Enclosure, with discounted beer and hearty food on offer. The CIU runs its annual CIU Greyhound Racing Night each September at Sheffield's Owlerton Stadium.

Events – CIU Beer & Trades Exhibition

Taking place during Conference Weekend each April, the CIU Beer & Trades Exhibition provides a great opportunity for club delegates to attend a free trade show which is specifically targeted at the needs of CIU clubs. The show provides a great day out for club folk, as the many exhibitors – including several of the CIU's Preferred Suppliers such as Carlsberg UK, Dransfields, Heineken UK and AON UK – show attendees how they can help increase profits and save money on running costs at their clubs.

Sport & Games

The Union is one of the biggest organisers of sporting competitions in the country with more than 2,000 trophies, valued at around £500,000, being competed for at both a National and Branch level. The following Indoor Championships are held annually: Team Darts, Team Pool, Team Snooker, Individual Snooker, Individual Darts, Individual Pool, Dominoes 5s and 3s, Dominoes Straights and Cribbage Pairs. There is also a very well respected Dransfields CIU National Quiz competition which attracts some of the UK's top quizzers.

The CIU Racing Club

The CIU Racing Club continues to go from strength to strength with more clubs taking advantage of special discounted tickets for club outings to a variety of racecourses across the country. Each month, *Club Journal* publishes an updated list of fixtures for race meetings throughout the year for which CIU members can obtain their discounted tickets, as well as giving details of exciting 'one-off' offers and packages, including racedays at some of the country's top racing venues, including Haydock Park, Newcastle, Chepstow, Thirsk, Newbury and Newmarket.

CIU Official Website

The CIU's official website (www.wmciu.org.uk) was given a major overhaul with an improved look, content and navigation features. As well as providing contact details for Head Office and Branch personnel, the website has a 'Breaking News' section, designated pages for each Branch as well as links to the Union's Preferred Suppliers, entry forms for the various sports and games competitions run by the CIU. It also has a complete database, regularly updated, of all the clubs affiliated to the CIU.

1. Scope of tariff

This tariff applies to performances of copyright music within PRS for Music's* repertoire* at clubs bona fide established and conducted in good faith as non profit-making members' clubs capable of satisfying:

- the conditions for determining a qualifying club for the purposes of Part 4 of the Licensing Act 2003 for England and Wales, or
- the conditions prescribed for the purposes of section 125 of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 by reg. 2 of the Licensing (Clubs) (Scotland) Regulations 2007 for Scotland, or
- the conditions for registration under the Registration of Clubs (Northern Ireland) Order 1996 for Northern Ireland.

It does not apply to establishments whose main object is bingo nor to youth or proprietary clubs.

Pursuant to an Order of the Copyright Tribunal dated 7 October 2013, this tariff does not apply to premises operated by not-for-profit-amateur sports clubs that qualify for Tariff AMS.

2. General conditions

This tariff is subject to *PRS for Music's* General Conditions Applicable to Tariffs and Licences, available on request from *PRS for Music*.

3. Royalty rates

Where the music user *has* applied for and obtained *PRS for Music's* licence before musical performances commence, the **standard** royalty rate will be charged and payable for the first year of the licence.

Where the music user *has not* applied for and obtained *PRS for Music's* licence before musical performances commence, the **higher** (standard plus 50%) royalty rate will be charged and payable for the first year of the licence.

After the first year of the licence, in either case, the **standard** royalty rate will be charged and payable.

The following rates of charge apply to all royalties falling due from 1st August 2016.

4. Value Added Tax

Every Licensee under PRS for Music's tariffs will pay to PRS for Music in addition to the royalty due, a sum in respect of Value Added Tax calculated at the relevant rate on the royalty payable.

5. Inflation adjustment

Every year on 1st August the monetary sums in this tariff will be adjusted for inflation. The adjustment formula will apply to the standard rates, using the mean (to the nearest whole percentage point) of the percentages by which the Retail Prices Index and Average Weekly Earnings index (unadjusted) change in the year to the previous March.

March is the latest month prior to the anniversary date for which figures are likely to be published for both indices. After application of the inflation adjustment any expenditure threshold figure will be rounded to the nearest pound, with all other royalty rates rounded to the nearest penny.

All royalties will be charged at the royalty rate in force at the beginning of the licence year.

6. Definitions

- **annual expenditure on the provision of music** means the total of:

gross salaries, gross wages; plus fees, expenses or other emoluments paid to performers (excluding any disc jockeys);

and gross fees (net of any Value Added Tax) paid to third parties for the services of performers.
- **audio jukebox** means a machine (other than a video jukebox) for playing recorded music, capable of being operated by the insertion of a coin, token or card.
- **audio jukebox with background music facility or video jukebox with background music facility or combined audio/video jukebox with background music facility or music centre and/or radio cassette player** means a combination of units of equipment capable of reproducing sound from more than one source through a single sound system.
- **background or mechanical music** means music when performed by a record player, compact disc player, tape player, or video player otherwise than for featured purposes, or music performed by a radio or television set operated on the premises or diffused through a loud-speaker from another part of the premises or a source outside the premises.
- **capacity** shall be calculated as follows:

where the accommodation of a room is limited to the number of seats, the capacity will be calculated by reference to the total number of seats; but where, as in the case of discotheque performances, there is no formal means of calculating the accommodation of a room, that capacity will be assessed by reference to the maximum number of persons which can reasonably be accommodated in the room or which is permitted under any regulation by Fire Authorities or under the Club's Rules. Where the capacity exceeds 100 persons one quarter of the charge will be levied on each 25 persons.
- **featured music or featured recorded music** means music performed by:

performers in person, or

a record, compact disc or tape player primarily for entertainment such as by means of discotheque equipment or otherwise for dancing or in conjunction with cabaret or similar entertainment, or

cinematograph equipment or video player.
- **karaoke performances** means those performances given by unpaid singers in conjunction with specially produced recorded music, with or without the provision of video-presented synchronised lyrics.
- **music centre** means instruments combining a radio and a tape player and/or record player.
- **performers** means singers and performers of musical instruments, including orchestra conductors or leaders, whether or not they combine in their performance other activities such as dancing or acting as comperes.
- **PRS for Music** is the trading name of the Performing Right Society Limited
- **PRS for Music's repertoire** means all and any musical works (including any words associated therewith), the right of public performance in which is controlled by PRS for Music or by any of the societies in other countries with which PRS for Music is affiliated.
- **record, compact disc or tape player** means any gramophone, compact disc, tape or cassette player, or other mechanical/electronic contrivance for playing musical works, except:

a video player, or

a contrivance, such as a jukebox, capable of being operated by the insertion of a coin, token or card.
- **video jukebox** means a machine for playing recorded music synchronised with a video or similar visual display and capable of being operated by the insertion of a coin, token or card.
