

CROOKES SOCIAL CLUB, SHEFFIELD

Crookes Social Club celebrated its Centenary in August with a three-day party and finds itself looking forward to the future with huge confidence thanks to its successful blend of tradition and innovation

You might be surprised to learn that the No.1 rated venue in Sheffield for Nightlife, Bars and Clubs on the website Trip Advisor is not some glitzy nightclub, cocktail bar or theme pub but is actually Crookes Social Club, a traditional CIU club which was established in 1919.

But after a visit to the club, it's clear just why the club has received so many five-star online reviews from visitors, with the warmth of its welcome by the staff and officials equalled only by the huge array of activities that go on within its walls.

Whether it's watching live music in the impressive 500-capacity Concert Hall, playing bowls on the expansive Crown Green behind the club, enjoying a game of snooker on one of the three full-sized tables in the Games Room, taking part in an Argentine tango session or simply savouring an immaculately kept beverage in the comfortable Lounge – to mention just a few of the enticements offered by the club – you get the feeling that the club is trying its absolute best to garner appeal right across the community.

“We're determined to get as many people

in through the doors as possible,” says Secretary and General Manager Maurice Champeau.

“The club has continued to evolve as part of a plan which was put into practice around four years ago when the club was at a low ebb with profitability plummeting and members and Committee members having to donate money to keep the club afloat.

“In the past three years, we've moved back into being profitable with an increase of 12 per cent profit last year.”

Central to the plan was making full use of one of the club's prize assets, the Concert Room, which has been at the centre of the revival with the club aiming to recapture the club's former reputation as a music venue for up-and-coming rock bands, as well as hiring out the room for private functions and events.

“The plain fact of the matter is that the club won't stay open if we just solely rely on making money from our members. We have to generate income from other sources and that's what the Concert Hall gives us,” says Maurice.

“It's a great space and has played host to

some huge names over the years, most notably rock band Def Leppard who played their first paid gig at the club before going on to sell a hundred million albums and sell out stadiums across the world.

“There's a commemorative plaque at the front of the club which was unveiled by the group themselves back in 1995 so it's great to have that sort of heritage here.

“There's a real need for a mid-sized music venue in Sheffield and we have been very successful in marketing our Concert Hall in recent years with the club hosting some very high-profile events, including an album launch concert by renowned Sheffield singer Richard Hawley which gained publicity in the national music press and on BBC 6 Music, as well as a gig by indie band Good Cop Bad Cop.

He adds: “We're very lucky that the Concert Room is self-contained with a separate bar that has its own licence, so it means that we can run a big event or host a private function with no disruption for the members who can enjoy themselves in the Lounge and take part in the more traditional side of things like bingo, snooker, pool,

darts, quizzes – or just enjoying a couple of drinks at the bar.

“The Concert Room is in use every night during the week for various dance and fitness classes and it’s also the home of Sheffield Jazz who rent it out for 20 Fridays during the year.

“This month, it’s ‘Rocktober’ in the Concert Hall with three big rock acts - Coyote, Thor - Gods of Rock and Mahogany Newt – all playing successive Saturdays and we’ll do some great business across the bar for all three nights as it’s free entry.”

In addition to the music events, the room has also hosted wrestling, boxing and martial arts tournaments.

“It’s a very flexible space and we want to ensure that we get the best possible return from it,” says Maurice.

A recent boost to the club’s balance sheet saw the room hired out as a filming location for *Everybody’s Talking About Jamie*, a major film starring Richard E Grant and Sarah Lancashire.

“It’s the film adaptation of the West End musical about a working-class Sheffield lad and his journey to become a famous drag queen and we were delighted to be chosen as a location,” says Maurice.

“They filmed here for about 15 days and transformed some areas of the club for the cameras, putting in pink lighting, installing table lights on all the furniture, even temporarily replacing our club sign at the front with the name of the fictitious club – Moorhill Social Club.

“At one point they brought in around 300 extras for one scene so it was a major production.

“We were also used as a film location

about three years ago for an ITV comedy, *Brief Encounters*, and it’s something we would like to do more of in the future as it’s a very useful revenue stream for the club, even if it can be disruptive.

“The club currently makes around 40 per cent of its profits from non-members – mainly from music events and private functions – but crucially we bring in that income without compromising on providing services for our members.

“And obviously having plenty going on at the club means you have more potential members coming through the doors.

“We installed a new EPOS till system last week which enables us to do two-tier pricing for members and non-members and that has been a real incentive for people who are perhaps regular visitors to music events to become members.”

So, as the club continues on its mission to evolve, it has been clear about ensuring it has a wide appeal to the residents in its local area, many of whom are students.

“Obviously Sheffield is a big university town so we have made major efforts to ensure that we’re getting a good slice of the ‘student pound’ in a city where that’s a very competitive area,” says Maurice.

“Some of our bar staff are students and that really helps to increase awareness among the student population.

“We’ve also hosted student events, like the Sheffield Medics Revue and a student band night, on our stage so it’s something that we’re definitely looking to develop further going forward.”

The club celebrated its Centenary back in

August with a three-day weekend event entitled ‘Crookesfest’ which kicked off with club favourites Thor – Gods of Rock playing on the Friday night, a festival-style line-up of local bands playing throughout the Saturday and rounded off with a family-friendly beach party on the Sunday with more live music and children’s entertainment.

“It was a great party weekend which demonstrated just how rooted the club is in the local community,” says Maurice.

“Throughout the year we open our doors to local charity groups with a Cancer Care event raising over £7,000 in one night.

“We have also raised money for the Sheffield Children’s Hospital with a series of fundraisers. In total, events at the club over the past 12 months have raised over £40,000 for a number of charities.”

Bowling is another mainstay of the club with a thriving section that fields around 13 teams in the local Sheffield Parks leagues.

The bowls section also held a special charity tournament to coincide with the club’s Centenary weekend celebrations which saw members competing in fancy dress.

All in all, the club looks to be in a great position, its blend of tradition and innovation helping to safeguard the future of this historic club.

Clubs report further correspondence from MPLC over licences

Several CIU clubs have reported that they have received further correspondence from the Motion Picture Licensing Company (MPLC).

The position regarding the requirement for a licence has recently been clarified in writing by MPLC in the following terms:

“The amendment to Section 72 (Copyright, Designs and Patents Act 1988) does not only cover ‘film’, but instead it covers any creative work, which will include not only films, but also television shows.”

It has been made clear that a licence is NOT required for unedited sports coverage or any other TV broadcast which does not contain creative work. This would arguably include (but isn't necessarily restricted to) the following:

- Sports coverage
- News
- Weather
- Live events (such as a Royal Wedding, etc)

The CIU has informed MPLC that the majority of clubs with

televisions will use them solely to show sport. They have advised on the following terms:

“It is doubtful that clubs actually know what is being broadcast, and whether films or other creative work are included in the broadcast. Such works frequently come on air, and unless there is someone actively monitoring the content that is being broadcast, you cannot be certain that unlicensed works are not being broadcast and that our studio partners' rights are therefore being infringed.”

In the circumstances the advice to CIU Affiliated clubs is that, providing clubs restrict their coverage to sports, news and other events as listed above, they should not need a licence from MPLC or any other similar body.

Please note that this in no way affects the need for additional licences required to show free-to-air broadcasts in relation to music content by the collective licences provided by PRS and PPL.

Please keep Head Office updated if you receive any further direct contact which contrasts with this advice or if your club receives a complaint or a fine for alleged copyright infringement.

MEMBERS' CORNER

Most people assume if they have installed smoke alarms, in the event of a fire everyone will hear the warning sounds and respond accordingly.

Sadly, this is not always the case. Research recently from the University of Durham conducted a study with 650 children from different age groups to test their wake-up response to sound signals from various smoke alarms, activated during the night while they were asleep.

The study showed that when the detectors were sounded with a high frequency very few of the children were woken by the continual beeping of the device.

The alarms used to conduct the study all met with Regulated Industry Safety Standards but showed half the children ignored the alarm's warning beeps and continued to stay sleeping.

Both high and low frequency smoke detectors were tested. Adults can hear and respond to a high frequency but it was discovered children hear and respond differently especially when they are asleep.

It was determined the children who did not wake up to the noise had not heard the alarms from the high frequency device but when tested, the study showed low frequency alarms, with voice activation included with the continual beeping sound, proved far more effective in alerting the children to wake up.

Smoke alarms by law are required to reach 85 decibels in a range of 10ft. To check any device before you purchase look for these details on the packaging. For safety it is recommended to have a smoke detector fitted on every level of a home and fire experts recommend organizing a fire drill with your family.

It is certainly a good safety precaution for a household to know what to do in case of an emergency. You may only have seconds to evacuate as any fire, if not contained, can quickly spread before emergency services can reach the scene.


